

It's time to get out those paints, brushes and pencils for the Annual Pro Loco Art Competition! The competition opened on 6th February and will close on 25th May. If you wish to enter this year's competition you must register by completing an entry form. You can register by going to www.matlockbathparishcouncil.gov.uk or contact the Clerk for an entry form.

After the closing date all entrants will be contacted to arrange a day/time for the work to be 'dropped off'. An independent adjudicator will shortlist entries and these entries will be displayed on Monday 4th June 2012 in the Pump Room (Pavilion) where members of the public will be invited to vote for their favourites.

On Tuesday 5th June 2012 a presentation ceremony will be held again in the Pump Room where winners will be announced and prizes awarded.

The main rule of the competition is that the picture must be of a scene or artefact of Matlock Bath.

The Parish Council is grateful to its sponsors - Turners Art Materials Ltd of Rowsley, Heights of Abraham and Derbyshire County Council - who are supporting this event. The 1st prize and 2nd prize money has been kindly donated by Sir Richard Arkwright's Masson Mills Working Textile Museum. All previous 32 winners of the competition are housed at the Masson Mills Working Textile Museum. If residents would like to view these pictures please contact the Clerk.

Prizes will be awarded as follows: 1st Prize - £150, 2nd Prize - £100, Best Villager - £50. Prizes for Young Artist and Junior Artists will be awarded in the form of Gift Vouchers for various outlets.

Remember you must register and have your artwork ready by 25th May 2012.

All pictures submitted will be on our website after the closing date.



Diamond Jubilee Street Party - Sunday 3rd June 2012

Please note that Temple Walk will be closed from 8.00am until 10.00pm. As always this is a community event and not an event run by Temple Hotel Ltd. It will be held at this location due to space, flatness of the road and toilet facilities.

A competition has been held for the children of the village to design the invitation. Please look out for it coming through your door.

If you or anyone you know that lives in Matlock Bath does not receive an invitation please let us know. All residents of the village are invited. Some of the children in the village will parade their "flotilla" on Temple Walk from 12.30pm and your support of this would be very welcome. Raft Event 2011 – Stuart Bird, The Derbyshire Association of Sub Aqua Clubs

Do you know there are two 4.30's on Boxing Day? I can assure you there are because that's the time the day starts for the organisers of the Raft Event. After erecting the gazebo in the quarry, the first raft turned up closely by the burger van and St Johns Ambulance. By 6.30 am, still dark, more rafts arrive. By 9.00 am spectators arrive trying to find the best point to watch the event. Spectators come from miles to watch the event, some coming every year. At 10.30 am a telephone call confirms that all rafts have left the start point and making their way down the river. At 11.35 am the rafts start to arrive at the finish line. Everyone is laughing, joking and generally having a good time. All competitors have to be checked out of the water or accounted for by their team mates and have their picture taken. The very last craft to complete the course is always the rescue boat. The rescue boat ensures that the river is clear – picking up anyone who needs assistance and ensuring all the rafts and rafters have completed the course. This information is then passed on to the event co-ordinator and St Johns Ambulance station. Any debris left in the river is cleaned up. A total of 192 competitors entered the event in 2011 on 39 rafts travelling 4 miles down the River Derwent. Below are pictures from the event. All of the photographs taken at the event are on the Parish Council's website – www.matlockbathparishcouncil.gov.uk 2011 saw the 49th raft event and the winners were:

1st – Beach Boys, 2nd – Hogwarts Express, 3rd – Thunderbirds 2

The total money raised on the day was £8,914.92, proceeds of which go to the RNLI.

The Derbyshire Association of Sub Aqua Clubs, who organise the annual event, would like to say a big thank you to everyone who took part or helped in any way with the event.

This year it is the 50th anniversary and hopefully will be an even bigger and better event and raise more money for the RNLI.







County Council Report - CIIr Garry Purdy

Having previously met with the Chairman of the Friends of Cromford Canal, Mr Patrick Morris, at one of their Open Days last year, I went away determined to try and do something to help raise monies for the upkeep and maintenance of Cromford Canal.

I am more than delighted to report that on 1^{st} February 2012, at the Full Council meeting at County Offices, Matlock, the Capital Work programme for this next financial year includes a sum of £300,000 approved towards the dredging of the canal. This has been an area of real concern for the Friends of Cromford Canal, and those of us that walk the canal towpath and have witnessed the Canal's decline in depth these past few years due to the overgrowth of vegetations etc.

Naturally this work will be carried out in an environmentally sensitive manner to cater for the wildlife that enjoys the benefit of the Canal.

As Chairman of the Derwent Valley Community Rail Partnership I will be attending a two day seminar in Sheffield in March, when discussions will take place with East Midlands Trains and Network Rail Senior Management on the Partnership Rail schemes in the East Midlands, of which the Derwent Line is one, and the forthcoming renewal of the franchise for this line, and onward to St Pancras by East Midlands Trains.

EMT have contributed so much not only to the Partnership, but also to the viability and reliability of the line and timekeeping which has resulted in significant increases in passenger numbers using the line. This we must continue to maintain and I hope to play my part in bringing that message forward.

The line is of vital importance to the Dales and in particular the villages that sit on the line such as Matlock Bath, providing a vital link for business and tourism. I also note with interest the business plan for the Whistlestop Centre as provided recently by Derbyshire Wildlife Trust and I wish them every success with the venture.

Finally, I would just like to add that I am working with our Officers at Derbyshire Dales and the Police with regard to the visit by Travellers to the Coach Park at Matlock Bath. It is a sensitive issue and one governed by Government policy which we have to adhere to. If anyone has any concerns with regard to this matter then do please contact me.

Help our Pavilion by Using the Cash Machine - Gregor Macgregor

With the 3-year lease, which The Grand Pavilion Ltd has now taken, comes the income from the Cash Machine outside the Pavilion. The rent that we receive from this machine depends on the number of transactions. This number is counted irrespective of how much you withdraw, we will get between 0p and 20p per transaction. So 33 transactions per day give us nothing, but 83 transactions will give us £1,500 per quarter.

All this money will help us to keep the building in good repair. So help us by using the machine often for smaller amounts. If you want £60, do three transactions for £20.


It costs you nothing; but the Grand Pavilion benefits! This money will be put towards catching up on the backlog of maintenance, left by the council. Once we have caught up with maintenance, the income will be put towards the "Roof Fund". This fund will eventually be large enough to carry out any major repairs, which may be necessary to the roof or other parts of the building.

Fell Race - John Middleton

On the 24th April 2012 at 7pm, a fell race has been organised in Matlock Bath. Registration is at the New Bath Hotel, parking for competitors on Temple Walk Car Park, with the start on Clifton Road.

This is a new fell race of four miles with 1100 feet of ascent being run under the auspices of the national Fell Runners Association and it has been given an 'A' rating. This refers to the steepness of the course. We think this is the only race in the immediate area with this FRA rating. Fell running is a popular Peak District sport and it is to be hoped that a race of this calibre will attract the top runners.

The route goes up the Wapping path to Upperwood. From there, it passes Ember Farm, goes close to Bonsall before ascending Masson Hill. From Masson, the runners descend to the Limestone Way path before skirting round to the Heights of Abraham and back through the woods to Ember Farm. The descent from Ember Farm gradually steepens; hill runners will love the final half mile. To run freely downhill is one of the joys of fell running. The race finishes at the New Bath Hotel.

The race would not be going ahead without the support of local people. Thanks are due to Chris Lugg at the New Bath, David and Edward Ironmonger, David Abbott, Philip Boam, Roger Bostock, Michael Wilderspin and neighbour and the residents of Clifton Road.

Recycling & Fundraising - For the past few months teachers and pupils at Matlock Bath Holy Trinity School have been involved in the Eco School's campaign to raise awareness of and improve the ecological impact that our school has on the environment. Much of our work has been based around recycling and how we can reduce our waste within school. As part of this recycling campaign, we have arranged to take part in the "Bags2School" scheme. This involves anyone involved with the school or within the community collecting good quality clothing, handbags, belts, shoes, soft toys, curtains and bed linen (NOT pillows or duvets) to full sacks supplied by Bags2School. These are returned to school and collected by the company, then sorted and resold in Eastern European countries, thus re-using every item donated. School are then paid 50pence for every kilo collected! More information can be found at www.bags2school.com Special sacks will be delivered to the school after the Easter holidays and will be available for you to collect (children at school will be sent home with sacks). Sacks can then be filled and must be returned to school by **FRIDAY 4TH MAY.**

So, take the opportunity for a spring sort out, get involved in our recycling campaign, and earn money for our school at the same time! Any money you help raise for school funds to assist the education of the children is always greatly appreciated.
